More than just sound, *Moonbeams and Mist* is a reflection on the human condition. It's about pushing through life's dense fog—the confusion and uncertainty of modern existence. As frontman Tyler 'Buck' Watts explains:

"We're all racing towards something, but half the time we don't even know what it is.

The fog, the mist—that's just a metaphor for how lost we are, consumed by a world that values speed over depth. We wanted to create a track that captures that tension—the feeling of being on the edge, ready to break through."

Having lived all over the world, from NYC and Macau to Tokyo and Berlin, Neon Gods' music is infused with the restless creative energy of these places. This isn't polished, commercial sound—it's raw, lo-fi, and unpolished—an ode to the unspoken, the unseen. Every note feels like it's pulled from a forgotten back alley or a smoky club where time stands still.

Buck reflects further on the 'noir' essence of their work:

"The night—especially in cities—represents more than darkness. It's a mirror, a refuge. The fog we talk about? It's the distraction of modern life, where we're running on autopilot, detached from ourselves. As consumers, as managers, as employees. But sometimes, in the silence, in the spaces between, you find clarity. Our music offers the in-between, the night, as a possible escape to another state of being where one can experience what it really means to be human."

This track isn't just for fans of indie, post-rockabilly, minimal, vintage, experimental, and lo-fi blues and rock. It's for anyone who feels that restlessness—that itch for something deeper. As Buck adds:

And, laughing, he adds:

"You're probably reading this in a rush, stressed out, on your overpriced 'mandatory' iPhone or device, just another cog in the big machine called the music industry. That reduces you too, to a cog, a one-dimensional functionary in capitalism. But you're so much more, right!? Luckily, after the day comes the night, where you can be truly human again... Hang in there! And escape with us. More often. And beyond...!"

3. Band Bio | Neon Gods and The Last Rites Strippers

Neon Gods and The Last Rites Strippers are urban nomads, straddling the line between rebellion and reverence, offering up a love letter to the city night and its hidden pulse. Led by frontman and guitarist-vocalist Tyler Watts—known to friends as "Buck" (a nickname earned after a charmingly clumsy poetry recital atop a bar table)—the band has traversed the underground scenes of cities like NYC, Berlin, and Bangkok, soaking in the electricity of after-hours life.

Their music? A cinematic 'noir' tapestry—lo-fi minimalism meets post-rockabilly, stitched together with vintage rock, blues, experimental and found sounds. Imagine the neon streets of Wong Kar-Wai's Hong Kong colliding with the shadowy corners of Berlin's underground clubs, filtered through the lens of Tsai Ming-liang's debut film. Here, though, the true protagonist isn't the setting—it's *the sound*. Neon Gods approach music like filmmakers, with sound taking the lead role.

Moonbeams and Mist, their second single, (out October 4th, 2024) is an anthem about shedding the mist—the ties, the hassles, the noise of daily life—and reconnecting with that untamed raw self, hiding underneath it all. It's also a nod to a simpler time: when Tyler's parents first danced together to his dad's friends' rockabilly and early beat band, belting out tunes on self-made guitars and amps. As Tyler puts it:

"We aren't just capturing a sound; we're performing a memory, a feeling that transcends time."

Later in October, Neon Gods will release their third single—an ambient track with Detroit techno influences—before the full debut *The Noir Album* arrives in early November. A sonic film filled with washed-out bass lines, slow-slung guitars, and two final ambient tracks that end the journey on a hauntingly atmospheric note.
